I know that the Prophet Mohammed (Peace be Upon Him) is held in great esteem by the Islamic community.



Shahada or Faith

Shahada-Declaration of Faith

لا إله إلا الله محمد رسول الله

(lā 'ilāha 'illallāh, Muhammad rasūlu-llāh)

(in Arabic)

There is no god but ALLAH, and Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah.

(in English)


Muslim people believe in Allah and that Mohammed is his messenger.
This is their central creed.

Salaah or Prayer



Muslims pray 5 times a day, and use the postures shown above.
Most men attend their Mosque once or twice day
but women usually pray at home.

Sawm or Fasting



Muslim people fast especially in the month of Ramadan, but also at other times. Fasting in Islam means abstaining from eating and drinking in daylight hours. Most people eat small meals during the hours of darkness.

Wash hands up to the wrist three times

Wash mouth three times

Wash nostrils, breathing in and out through the nose three times

Wash one's face three times

Wash arms up to elbows three times

Wipe head with wet hands, forehead to back, back to forehead

The inside of the ears are cleaned with the wet forefinger


then the back of the ears with the thumb

Wash feet up to the ankles three times

Raise one's face to the sky, pointing up with the index finger.

Muslims practice sawm, or fasting, for the entire month of Ramadan.

This means that they may eat or drink nothing, including water, while the sun shines.

Most eat small meals in the hours of darkness

Fasting is one of the five pillars (duties) of Islam.

As with other Islamic duties,
all able Muslims take part in Sawm from about age 12.

When the month of Ramadan begins, Muslims enter into a period of discipline and worship:



fasting during the day, and praying during the day and night
During Ramadan, special evening prayers are conducted during which
Long portions of the Qur'an are recited.
These special prayers are known as Taraweeh.

Eid-ul-Fitr or **Id-Ul-Fitr**, often abbreviated simply as 'Eid', is one of the most important festivals of Islam celebrating the triumph of good over evil, and **forgive** their neighbours for old grudges and ill feelings.
