
God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit: The Trinity



God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit: The Trinity


‘If you love me,

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Core learning: I have been given opportunities to be still and quiet in order to pray to God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Core learning: I have begun to study some of the words of the Creed and I have begun to identify those parts which speak of the Mystery of the Trinity

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
The Sign of the Cross and the Glory Be are the most common Trinitarian prayers.

Both are creeds or statements of belief in the Trinity.
