

John 13:1-15

The Washing of the Feet

Now before the festival of the Passover,
Jesus knew that his hour had come
to depart from this world and go to the Father.
Having loved his own who were in the world,
he loved them to the end.

The devil had already put it into the heart
of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him.

And during supper Jesus,
knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands,
and that he had come from God and was going to God,
got up from the table, took off his outer robe,
and tied a towel around himself.

Then he poured water into a basin
and began to wash the disciples' feet
and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him.

The Washing of the Feet

He came to Simon Peter, who said to him,
‘Lord, are you going to wash my feet?’

Jesus answered,

‘You do not know now what I am doing,
but later you will understand.’

Peter said to him, ‘You will never wash my feet.’

Jesus answered, ‘Unless I wash you,
you have no share with me.’

Simon Peter said to him,
‘Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!’

Jesus said to him, ‘

One who has bathed does not need to wash,
except for the feet, but is entirely clean.

And you are clean, though not all of you.’

For he knew who was to betray him;

2of3 for this reason he said, ‘Not all of you are clean.’ P3




Pope Francis washes the feet of prisoners on Holy Thursday

The Washing of the Feet

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe,
and had returned to the table, he said to them,
'Do you know what I have done to you?

You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right,
for that is what I am.
So if I, your Lord and Teacher,
have washed your feet,
you also ought to wash one another's feet.

For I have set you an example,
that you also should do as I have done to you.



To wash a person's feet means to serve and care for them.

Core learning:

I can explore the concept of "neighbour" through listening to the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10: 25-37) and I understand that "neighbour" means more than the people I know.

The Parable of the Good Samaritan

Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus.
‘Teacher,’ he said, ‘what must I do to inherit eternal life?’

He said to him, ‘What is written in the law? What do you read there?’

He answered, ‘You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.’

And he said to him, ‘You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.’



The Parable of the Good Samaritan

But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus,
'And who is my neighbour?'

Jesus replied,

'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho,
and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him,
beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead.

Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when
he saw him, he passed by on the other side.

So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and saw him,
passed by on the other side.

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


The Parable of the Good Samaritan

But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity.

He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them.

Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend."

The Parable of the Good Samaritan

Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?’

He said, ‘The one who showed him mercy.’

Jesus said to him, ‘Go and do likewise.’

- 1. Love for God**
- 2. Love for People**

- an older person who needs help or company


