The Sacrament of Confirmation

PREPARATORY NOTES

Introduction

The Sacrament of Confirmation will follow the order as laid out in the Rite of Confirmation (2016). Every effort should be made not to cloud the liturgy with other elements. These often detract from the central gestures of prayer, the laying on of hands, the anointing with Chrism and the celebration of the Eucharist.

Incidences where children might be viewed as “performing” either in song, mime or any other way should be avoided. The liturgy should be celebrated in a dignified but simple manner.

When Mass is celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation takes place after the proclamation of the Gospel.



Musical suggestions given throughout this text are given as examples and may be substituted for other appropriate hymns (see list of [alternative hymns](#)).

All Mass parts, including the Gloria and the psalm, should be sung.

Some Practical Considerations.

- The Archbishop should be invited to vest with the clergy.
- Parish Priests are kindly asked to gather the names of the children in their parish who are seeking Confirmation. These should be forwarded to the host parish no later than one week before the Sacrament is due to take place.
- The Parish Priest of the host parish is asked to co-ordinate seating. The children should sit together at the front of the church, with their sponsors sitting in the correct order on the other side of the church. This might be best achieved either by placing labels on seats or by having the sponsors and the children process into the church before the liturgy begins.
- The Parish Priest in the host parish is asked to be in contact with the schools involved and agree who should read the First Reading. This could be read by a teacher or a senior pupil.
- The Prayers of the Faithful (six in number) should be distributed among the various groups of children. The host Parish Priest is kindly asked to agree with the schools which children are to read these prayers. The Parish Priest of the host parish is asked to please organize the Procession of the Gifts.
- Where the liturgy is taking place in the Cathedral the Curial Offices will invite one of the Parish Priests involved to co-ordinate these preparations.
- If required a small group of singers, or a cantor could be made be available to support the singing of the congregation. Should this kind of assistance be required the Parish Priest in the host parish might contact Mgr. Fitzpatrick.
- The host parish is kindly asked to prepare a booklet for the Liturgy of Confirmation choosing suitable music for the celebration of the Sacrament.

First Reading

(In the absence of a deacon, one of the priests present should read the Gospel.)

The Celebration of Confirmation

Presentation of the Candidates

After the gospel the candidates are **individually** called by name. **Priests representing each of the parishes involved should call out the name of each child to be confirmed ("From the Parish of — the following children —").** As their name is called, each child should stand and say "I am here". The children should remain standing. After all of the candidates have been presented the bishop will address the candidates and all those present on the meaning of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

The Homily

The Renewal of Baptismal Promises

After the homily those to be confirmed should stand to renew their Baptismal Promises. A taper, which must be lit from the Paschal Candle, should be used to light the childrens' candles. Holding the candle in front of them throughout, the children should **loudly** respond 'I do' to each Baptismal Promise.

The Laying On of Hands

Following the Renewal of Baptismal Promises the bishop stands and after a period of prayer stretches his hands over the candidates before praying the Prayer for the Laying on of Hands. The silence that accompanies this prayer should be strictly observed.

The Anointing with Chrism

After the Prayer for the Laying on of Hands the bishop anoints the candidates with the Oil of Chrism. During this anointing, the congregation continues to pray and to sing. Each candidate makes their way to the bishop accompanied by their sponsor who places his or her hand on the shoulder of the person who is to be confirmed. **Candidates should wear a label displaying only their chosen Confirmation name. This should be clearly printed: 'Saint ___'.** Those waiting to receive Confirmation should be directed to come forwards to avoid a queue from forming.

At Confirmation, the Archbishop will say, "**Be sealed with the Holy Spirit**". The child should **clearly** respond, "**Amen**". The Archbishop will then say, "**Peace be with you**" and the child should say, "**And with your spirit.**" The Archbishop will then shake the child's hand.

During the Anointing with Chrism the following, or other suitable hymns, should be sung as required.

*Hymn 2 Holy Spirit of

*Hymn 3 Holy Spirit, come confirm
us (Brian Foley)*

After anointing, the liturgy should proceed to the Prayer of the Faithful **without** any further hymns.

The Prayer of the Faithful

Some children should be invited to read the General Intercessions. A text for the Prayer of the Faithful is at the end of this booklet.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist

Preparation of Gifts

The Procession of the Gifts should bring forward the bread and wine for the celebration of the Eucharist. Some of the newly confirmed should carry the gifts in the procession.
